

YES Charter Celebrates Strong Growth on Newly Released California Dashboard

YES is celebrating promising gains in core classes following the release of the 2024-25 California Dashboard results. The school posted significant growth in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Math, marking a strong upward trend that returns, or surpasses, student performance to pre-Covid levels.

ELA scores increased by 18.4 points, while Math scores rose by 12.2 points. These improvements place YES Charter's growth on par with the positive growth seen statewide, highlighting the hard work of students, teachers, and support staff. This achievement can be credited to focused instruction, targeted interventions, and a commitment to creating a supportive learning environment for all students.

While the academic gains are encouraging, the Dashboard also identified chronic absenteeism as an area for continued improvement. Consistent attendance is essential for maintaining academic progress.

With strong home to school partnerships, YES Charter is confident it can make meaningful strides in this measure as well. As the school moves forward, these latest results provide momentum and reaffirm the community's shared commitment to student success.
